Before Your First Class

Course Materials: You must purchase the book as described in the course description (\$20) in order for your registration to be complete. You will need to read chapter one in the *Little Book of Ethics* before your first class.

Before the course begins, the course materials (including the Little Book of Ethics) will be available on your Student Library page. If you already have a Student Library page set up, please access it to find them. If you do not already have a Student Library page set up, you will receive an email from [Amy Jones](#) with instructions for accessing your page. You can also contact Amy if you have any problems with the Student Library.

You will receive a roster, providing the names, and contact information of your instructors, fellow students, as well as the call-in information and access code for your class three days before the class begins. Please save this file, sent to you from kelly@lifecoachtraining.com so you will have that information.

If you have not received the above items two days before the class begins, please contact Amy or Kelly directly.

How the ILCT Teleclasses Work

- A few minutes before the scheduled class time, dial the phone number provided to you on the Class Roster. You will then enter the Access Code, followed by the # key to join your class. Please announce yourself so your instructor knows you are there.
- You may use a land line, cell phone, or computer (VoIP) to call into the class; however, if the method creates interference, you will be asked to place yourself on mute or disconnect and dial back into the call. For more information on connecting with your class, [click here](#).
- We encourage you to set aside the time for this class. You are expected to be there for the entire scheduled time. While we know there may be times when you cannot avoid calling in when you're in a noisy area, are on the road, or have to leave or arrive a minute or two late, we ask that you minimize these as they distract not only from your learning experience, but may also impact the group experience as well.
- Learn the mute function on your phone for those (hopefully rare) instances. You can also mute your own line on through the conference line system. To do that, you will press *6 to mute your line and *6 again to speak. Whatever method you choose, don't mute yourself before you let your instructor know that you are there.
- If you are late joining the call and the group is involved in a discussion, wait until there is a natural pause in the conversation or a question is posed that you would like to respond to. Then announce yourself before offering your comments.
- Enjoy the interaction among your fellow participants, while respecting the established [Privacy and Confidentiality Policy](#) as described on page 3 of the ILCT Policies and Procedures.

At the same time, make your points succinctly, share a quick story, ask a question simply, being sensitive to everyone's need to participate.
